 - I'm so busy, I'm afraid of adding something to my plate.
 - It's too big of a commitment to build a relationship with my neighbors.
 - I am particular about who I spend my time with and I don't want to spend time with my neighbors.
- 5. Do you think there is someone in your neighborhood who is scared of you? Why or why not? How can you help your neighbor's fears?
- 6. Peter says, "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." (1 Peter 3:15). What do you think that means? Have you ever had someone ask you the reason for the hope that you have?

Learn a specific neighbor's name this week. If you weren't able to walk your neighborhood and pray for your neighbors last week, do that as well.


Serve with Kairos Prison Ministry



Romania mission trip

ZPC sent a team of 4 people, including Donna Bahler, Sally Bias, Jerry Deck, and Dave Gall, to Romania from February 25-March 7. This team taught at a pastor's conference in Siniah and connected with several ZPC mission partners in Fetest, Giurgiu, and Campina. This morning, we will hear from Sally Bias about how the team saw God at work in Romania.

Romanian Mission Partners:

Missiolink acknowledges and addresses both spiritual and physical needs of the Romanian people through church development and through helping the most disadvantaged individuals in Romania: children at risk.

Bethel Home is an orphanage located in Fetest. The mission of the Bethel Home is to provide a Christ-centered, stable home environment (not to be a site for adoption) for orphans where children can thrive and learn life skills to prepare them to be productive citizens in Romania and in God's kingdom.

Mana Deschisa is a christian rehabilitation center for young women and mothers with children from the streets, orphanages, and prisons. This organization focuses on individuals battling addictions and those with challenging family backgrounds.
