

We're highlighting ZPC summer missions at each service this morning:

Home Group Discussion Guide Restoration in Progress

Week 3 | 9.22.19 Nehemiah 3

Icebreaker:

Would you prefer to play an individual sport or team sport? Would you prefer to be self-employed or work with a close-knit team?

Read Nehemiah 3 and discuss:

- 1. In Nehemiah 3:1, it says they consecrated or sanctified the wall. What might it mean to "sanctify" a wall or a building or a home? How might we view such structures, if they were sanctified?
- 2. In the first verse, Nehemiah says that the high priest and the other priests did their part in building. Why do you think he included them in the first verse? Is it important for a church today to see its pastors participating in the work?
- 3. Some in Nehemiah 3 chose not to rebuild the wall (nobles of Tekoa, verse 5). What is a typical good excuse that you use not to join in God's work?
- 4. In Nehemiah's description, the people helped repair the sections close to their homes and "next to" their actual neighbors. What is something you could do this week for God "close to home"?
- 5. Some of the wall would have used the remnants of the previous wall that had crumbled. When you have used brokenness in your own life for the greater good?
- 6. Nehemiah lists people from different professions that work on the wall (perfume-makers, goldsmiths, rulers of half-districts). What is a gift or a talent you have that you have been surprised God has been able to use?
- 7. Later generations would have read this passage and would have seen those who had gone before them had left a legacy by rebuilding the walls. What is something that previous generations left you that has impacted you in a positive way (could be emotional, physical, or a skill that you were taught)?
